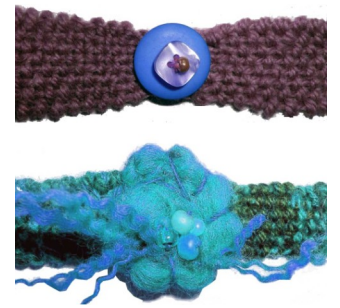
FIBER BLING JEWELRY with Sandra Cook

Using fiber (yarn/string) the student will learn a simple weaving technique to make bracelets, pins, and necklaces. Students will weave a basic form for the accessory they wish to make, learn finishing techniques for their weaving and simple clasps. Embellishments, such as, ribbon, beads, and buttons are added to create a one of kind wearable art piece. Ages 12+. Students will provide some of their own materials.

BASKET WEAVING with Dorrie Dean

Join this cultural anthropologist and long time weaving instructor in basket weaving from various cultures. Each class will provide the student with the necessary materials and basic techniques to complete one basket. Sign up for just one or all three! Ages 13+. Materials will be purchased directly from instructor at the beginning of the class.

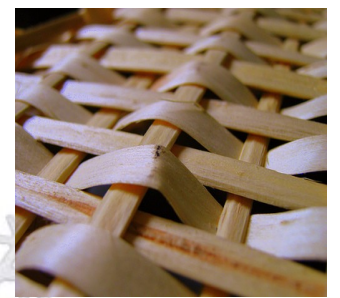

INTRO to OIL PAINTING with Kara Stenberg

Students will be introduced to the basic techniques of oil painting from becoming familiar to the various types of tools/equipment used, to mixing paint, to completing a painting from start to finish. Class will emphasize specific steps for creating a painting so that the student can carry this information with them into any oil painting project regardless of its complexity or scope. Each student will complete one painting. Ages 13+.

INTRO to WOOD POWER CARVING with Tracy Fowler of Fishaholics

Students will learn how to safely power carve wood into useable arts and crafts while gaining knowledge of the types of tools used, tips of the trade, wood selection and safety. This is a hands-on class that will allow students to learn how to use a variety of power carving tools to make a bowl, shrimp or butterfly out of a block of wood. The class will include learned tricks and techniques that will make the experience fun and interesting. Ages 16+ (with parental approval).

NATIVE SKIN SEWING with June Pardue

Presents basic hand techniques necessary for sewing with fur and leather as used by Alaska Natives. Examines working with patterns from Arctic regions of Alaska, how to select skins and leather, and how to create lining and trim rabbit or beaver hats. Upon registration, students will receive a supply list for the class and will be responsible for purchasing their own supplies.
